



# Year 7 Catch Up Funding 2019/20

#### Context

Catch-up Premium (funding) was introduced in September 2012. Schools are allocated funding for each student who on entry to year 7 who has' not achieved the standard', based on standardised scores in Reading and/or Maths at KS2. The funding is provided so that these students can be given the opportunity to catch up as quickly as possible with support in literacy and numeracy. The academy entitlement is calculated by the number of eligible students reported in the Autumn census returns and KS2 assessments. At Wodensborough Ormiston Academy, approximately 40% of our students were eligible for catch-up funding in Year 7 for the academic year 2018/2019. The SAT results in 2018 identified:

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# What has been the impact? 2018/19

# Literacy

Identified Cohort – 82 pupils (65% of the cohort are PP/Ever6, 33% SEN)

# **Numeracy**

Identified Cohort – 86 pupils (66 % of the cohort are PP/Ever6 36% SEND)

- 100% of identified cohort have made progress since their baseline test in Sept 18.
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- 45% have made accelerated progress exceeding their end of year target.
- 13% have made progress above their end of year target.
- 42% are meeting their end of year target.
- \*End of year targets are standandised tp p.8 progression flight paths and do not take into account SEND needs and include RADY uplift.
- 18% have made accelerated progress exceeding their end of year target.
- 6% have made progress above their end of year target.
- 76% are meeting their end of year target.
