

So what is 'Challenges'?

'**Challenges'** is part of our careers education programme designed to provide you with a variety of opportunities in order to raise your awareness and aspirations as you prepare to transition from year 10 to year 11.

There is a lot to think about in these final few weeks and thinking ahead is important to get ahead of the game.

What you can expect from challenges.

Challenges-Experiences of work

Your experiences of work, whether it be on site taking part in loud speaker live, or off site with an employer, will help you to gain the necessary skills to make you more employable. This will give you a head start as you start to prepare your CV and add to it.

Challenge- Personal guidance

The personal guidance that you will experience over the coming weeks will enable you to devise an action plan and think about your post 16 destinations. Your targets will involve research into A levels, Vocational qualifications, apprenticeships and employers.

Challenge-Using websites

You will be given a variety of websites to research different post 16 destinations to give a feel for what they have to offer and give you an idea of what grades you will need to get onto the right course for you. Your pathways into University will guide you to the sixth form or college that best suits your career aspiration.

Challenge – Thinking about University?

Access lots of information through the google classroom to explore different Universities through the virtual tours.

Challenge- Thinking about apprenticeships or higher apprenticeships? Which one?

Good question so log onto 'Get In Go Far' to find out more about the differences. Use the google classrooms to re- visit presentations or ask questions on the chat function.

Not sure still? No need to panic!

Visit sites such as 'Career Pilot' and 'Find Careers' and take the quizzes it may open your mind to options you had never considered.

What to say?

It is always difficult when people ask what do you want to do as a job/career and you simply don't know yet.... Try saying:

I am still weighing up my options... I think I would like to work outdoors... I enjoy sports so maybe that's something I would consider...

This is good interview practice to be able to word your responses more positively.

Challenges work experience- (CWEX) on site

If you don't have an offsite WEX placement, don't worry as you have secured a place on site called 'Challenges' work experience. You will follow a timetabled programme that will give you the same employability skills as pupils in the work place.

You will be able to write about these experiences on college applications and your CV.

You will receive certification for the activities that you take part in to demonstrate that you have acquired a variety of employability skills.

You will complete a work experience booklet in the same way that pupils in the work place have. These will be collected at the end of your week ready for work to continue with in year 11.

Your programme will be delivered by the National Citizenship Service (NCS).

Challenges – on site work experience programme.

What you need to know.

You are expected to attend your off-site work experience or your onsite Challenges programme every day. This will be certified and employers and providers will want to see this when you leave WOA>

You will not be expected to wear uniform for this programme but must wear appropriate clothing to take part in activities. (Please see your letter for more details about times, expectations etc..)

If you are interested in a career in the NHS there is an opportunity to take part in a virtual event on Thursday 12.30 – 3.10. This is a 2-hour workshop. You will be in an ICT room to take part in this event and will receive a certificate of completion for taking part as well as taking away some valuable information about careers. There are only 30 places available for this. You must book your place with Miss Atkins.

Work Experience- (WEX) Off site

If you have a work placement with an employer, you will have already received letters and may have taken part in an induction (where appropriate).

Your employer will have already told you about your hours of work and what to wear. (please see you letter for more details about your PPE and covid testing.

You will be visited in the work place by a member of staff in school and your attendance will be monitored by the attendance team. You must maintain an excellent attendance and punctuality record. Remember your employer can write you a reference which will be useful in the future. So make a good impression.

Challenges – 'coming back together'

It is important that before you break up for the summer, we all come back together as a year group. This will give you the chance to share your experiences with each other and for pupils off site to take part in some of the exciting activities on offer.

On Monday 19th and Tuesday 20th July you will start the final phase of your **Challenges Programme**:

- You will be expected to arrive to school at 8.45 and line up on the MUGA.
- You will not need to wear uniform.
