

What are Curriculum Choices?

Curriculum choices is a process that allows parents, teachers and yourselves to work together and ensure that when you begin Year 10 in September you will be starting the right GCSE and BTEC courses to help you succeed.

Through this process you will choose a number of subjects to take as qualifications in year 11.

Why Choose in Year 9?


The government and exam boards have worked together over the last few years to overhaul the GCSEs offered in England. These are now more challenging, and most include content that used to be taught at A level or higher.

All exam papers can now only be taken at the end of year 11.

We believe in offering all students a **broad curriculum** that provides access towards further education and a wide choice of career opportunities.

We offer a two year key stage 4 curriculum to give students a longer time on their Key Stage 4 examination courses and we firmly believe that this will further enhance students' learning, progress and achievement.


What is the EBACC?



The **English Baccalaureate**(FRACC) is a

(EBACC) is a performance measure used by the government.

To gain the EBACC you must achieve a grade 5 or above at the end of year 11 in all 5 subjects.



This means that by the time you are 16:

- Careers in areas of growth will be for higher skilled/qualified employees. (around 2 million extra jobs and growing...)
- Most people with a job will have a degree or higher.
- Average qualification level to rise for all occupations.



Some help with picking your subjects...

- 1. What do I want to do at 16+
 - Sixth Form?
 - Apprenticeship?
 - College?
 - Employment?
 - Training provider?
- 2. Choose the subjects that give you a clear pathway to help your post 16 destination.
- 3. Choose a well-balanced timetable. Try not to choose all of your subjects from the same area.
- 4. Try and chose subjects that the enjoy and are good at.
- 5. Do not pick a subject because you like that teacher as you may not have that teacher next year.
- 6. Do not avoid a subject that you are good at because you don't like the teacher who is teaching you now as you may not have the same teacher in the next 2 years.
- 7. Do not choose subjects just because your friends have chosen them.
- 8. Do not be afraid to choose unusual subjects.
- 9. Creative subjects can be very useful.
- 10. Try not to specialise too much.
- 11. Ask yourself if you are more suited to GCSE or BTEC method of learning? Or a combination?
- 12. Seek plenty of impartial advice and ask lots of questions.

Some things to think about...

- Some options may not run if not enough people pick it
- · You may not get a place on your first option because too many people have picked it.
 - If this happens we will try and distribute places fairly.
 - If your form is late being handed in you are less likely to get your first choice of subject.
- Final decisions on course choices will be made by Mr Wagstaff.
 - Behaviour will be a consideration.
 - Attendance will be a consideration.
 - Combinations of groups will be a consideration.

The wrong reasons to make a choice

- X I like the teacher
- X All the other choices are boring / too difficult
- X All my friends are doing that subject
- X I think it will help me get a job

The right reasons to make a choice

- √ I am good at that subject
- √ I enjoy the subject
- ✓ I know that these subjects will help my career choice, because I have found out about it
- √ I have achieved good results and the right exam grades in this subject

There is no race to be the first handed in!


How to make your choices on sims

- I. You will complete your registration for your account in your ICT lesson
- 2. log on to your account at https://www.sims-options.co.uk
- 3. Your parents will receive a registration email from noreply@sims.co.uk. If you have any difficulty registering you need to contact student.data@woacademy.co.uk
- 4. Your parents can also access the options process from within SIMS Parent App.

When you have completed the registration process this is what you will see.

- A number of lists will be displayed.
- Make your choices from these lists.
- At the top of each list advice on the number of subjects or reserves which can be chosen is given. To see all lists you should scroll down the screen

How to remove a choice



To remove a choice, click on the subject and the colour will change to grey.

To choose a Reserve subject click on the word Reserve to the right of the subject; it changes colour to orange and the display of choices made is updated:



If too many subjects are chosen a warning is displayed:

The choices you make are also displayed on the right of the screen as shown here. In this panel the order of these choices can be changed by clicking on the subject and then clicking on which course you want to replace in the order.
